Family Resource Networks (FRNs) are funded by the Government of Alberta to offer families community connection and support in building individual, family and community wellness

Miskanawah operates two FRN
 "Hubs" in the city; Tawaw West Tawaw
 East. Both Hubs link families to the
 specialized programming provided by
 the "Spokes"

- The Tawaw FRN Hubs offer a warm, family-friendly environment where people can drop-in to connect with each other, culture, and community supports
- Programming is offered to families with children, and youth aged 0-18 years
- Families can be referred, self-refer or drop-in to seek supports
- Programming is open to all who wish to connect with supports grounded in Indigenous teachings and culture

What Do We Offer? FRN Programs (Spokes)

Indigenous Home Visitation (East & West)

- In-home supports for families with children aged 0-6
- Strengthens family connection to cultural supports and community
- Helps build parental capacity and awareness of child's development

Indigenous Cultural Support (East & West)

- Offers connection to culturally relevant supports (Elders, cultural community events, ceremony) for all ages
- Traditional Medicine Harvesting; Cree
 Blackfoot Language Class
- Cultural offerings are ongoing and change often

AAWAAKSITOWATA "Early Childhood Paths of Life" - Early Intervention Team (East & West)

- Group and one-on-one parenting supports offered for parents and caregivers with young children
- Youth life-skills supports offered
- Cultural supports are offered through program activities

Rapid Access Counselling (East & West)

- Rapid-access, on-site counselling for parents and families
- Offered through Catholic Family Services

Grand Mother Turtle (East)

- Culturally safe early development programming for Indigenous children 0-6 years and their parents, grandparents, and other significant caregivers
- Offered through Awo Taan Healing Lodge Society

Culturally Informed Youth Well-Being Program (East)

- Culturally safe and traumainformed child and youth development programming for Indigenous children and youth ages 7-18 years and their parents, grandparents, and other significant caregivers
- Offered through Awo Taan Healing Lodge Society

Ke Mama Nnanik – Our Mother Earth Parent and Child Development Program (West)

- Weekly group parent and child development activities with peer support, mentoring, Elders and direct one-on-one supports. Open to all urban Aboriginal families with young children
- Offered through Métis Calgary Family Services
