Miskanawah (mis-con-a-wa), Cree for "many little roads and paths," is an Indigenous-led charitable organization offering supportive services grounded in cultural traditions and teachings. As its name implies, this approach guides individuals and families in building pathways to and within the community, strengthening their natural supports and engaging in healthier ways of living. Operating in Calgary for over 36 years, Miskanawah offer programs and services in the areas of family support, youth services, clinical and cultural mental health supports, crisis support, housing support, and cultural and ceremonial offerings.

Guided by the traditional teachings of Wahkotiwin (Cree Natural Law of interconnection and kinship, meaning "everything is related") our relationships and connections with those we serve are the foundation for the services we provide. Respect and recognition of culture is embedded in the work we do with children, youth, and families.

Our Mission: Guided by Indigenous teachings, Miskanawah offers culturally-based, supportive services to people in the Calgary area as they strengthen their circles of self, family, community, and culture.

Our Vision: Children, youth and families thrive within a culturally responsive community.






For the past 19 years, Miskanawah has hosted an annual Friendship Round Dance and it has since become the largest Round Dance in Western Canada! A Round Dance is an Indigenous social gathering that extends a welcoming invitation to everyone in a celebration of friendship, diversity, and inclusivity. Traditionally held during the colder months, this event encourages both our Indigenous and non-indigenous relatives within Treaty 7 territory and beyond to learn, connect, and engage in an evening of singing, drumming, and dancing.

In the words of Cree Elder, Patrick Daigneault, "Miskanawah's Round Dance offers the opportunity to make new friends and re-connect with old friends. This Round Dance is a family-friendly gathering where we can build relatives across all nations. It is a safe space to welcome children, youth, and families to share a meal together, sing, dance, and join in ceremony. With this in mind and heart, it is why Miskanawah extends a welcoming invitation for everyone—of all backgrounds, of all nations—to join us in circle."

This is great for bringing urban Indigenous families together because there's such a disconnect when a lot of these families are living in the city. So this helps them get reconnected with that culture, helps them, you know, feel part of a whole like a community. And it helps with getting reconnected, it helps them again rebuild that cultural acceptance, that pride of who they are and where they came from. And then also, you have the non-indigenous population that comes here. You know what they start learning about our culture, and the spirit of Truth and Reconciliation... that goes miles. This is ethical space for the non-indigenous people to learn about our culture. Meaning, it's a safe space for them without them being judged at all. So, they feel like they actually belong with our people as well."
